NATIONAL PARKS SENIOR LIFETIME PASS ABOUT TO SKYROCKET

The lifetime pass to all National Parks in the U.S. for people over 62 is set to jump dramatically sometime this year. Since 1994, the cost has been held at \$10, if purchased in person at one of the National Parks, or, \$20 if purchased by mail.
