More About Our Evolving Website

We want to take some extra space this month to point out some interesting changes and additions to our new website. First, archived NCCT Newsletters are back by popular demand. Currently, they go back to the start of this year (2017) and will be continually added through the end of 2018. At that time we may remove the 2017 issues (for space-saving concerns) and begin 2019. Either way, you'll always have at least one year of archived newsletters to look back on if you wish to revisit something, or if you feel you may have missed something in one of the past issues. These back issues can be found on the Newsletters page which is linked in the homepage menu. Also, beginning with this issue (November '17), the NCCT Newsletter will now be available online on the first day of every new month for those who would rather read it there. Just look for the new link at the bottom of the archive list each month. Your email copy will still be sent as usual if you prefer to read it that way. Another new feature is our monthly photo challenge called Best Shot. Each month, a new target area (metropark, nature preserve, botanical garden, etc.) will be chosen as the target and each member will then be challenged to go to that designated area during the upcoming month and take their best shot at winning this new monthly challenge. Each photographer will send just one photo (their best shot) to the webmaster before the deadline, which will be only a few days before the end of each month. All entries will then be posted (without any photographer identification) on the website on the Best Shot Contest page and all members can then vote for their favorite photo. The photographer(s) with the most votes will have their photo added to the Best Shot Album on that same page, a new target site will be announced, and the whole process will start over again for the new month. We are hoping for a high membership shooting participation rate and a very high voting participation rate. Please remember that this is your photo club/website. It will take the participation of each and every member to make this all work. So join in, speak up, participate, have a say. Speaking of which, we cannot emphasis enough that every photographer who has an album page, or has a photo posted elsewhere on the website, is the sole and total administrator of that content. If you want something changed – from a simple word in a caption, to a shuffle of the order of images in a slideshow, or an entire album removed, do not hesitate to let the webmaster know. No detail is too big or too small if it is your content. Your requests will usually be met within 24 hours of notification. And as always, thanks for your membership and for participating in your club.
