There will be some pictures of Fairbanks, but most will be of their 5-day experience within Denali National Park, which is located about 120 miles south of Fairbanks in south central Alaska. It is home to the tallest peak in North America, Denali, which is the reinstated original name given to it by the native Athabaskan people of that region until it was renamed Mount McKinley, in honor of the

25th President, for a number of decades.


Mary Figgins Update

Two More Nature Areas Begin Development

Two new nature areas have been announced, are already in the process of development and should be opening soon in the local area. The first, Howard Marsh Metropark, is scheduled to open in the spring of 2018. Located in eastern Lucas County, it will include 1,000 acres of converted agricultural land that will be restored to a natural wetlands habitat. Amenities will include: Two miles of hiking trails, including boardwalks, 6 miles of permanent, deep water channels for fishing, kayaking and canoeing, with the latter being dependent on water levels at any given time of the year. Additionally, this area should provide for reduction of storm water runoff into Lake Erie and aid in attracting migratory birds to this area during that annual springtime event.

The second will be called Manhattan Marsh, which will be a 70-acre park in the Manhattan Blvd – Suder Ave area of North Toledo. It's development will take place over the next two years and will include boardwalked hiking trails and a kayak launch there as well. This will be in keeping with the Metroparks master plan of having a metropark within 5 miles of every resident in Lucas County.
