Howard Marsh Metropark Now Open

It's now official, as of April 28th, 2018, the 16th Toledo-area Metropark (and second largest by area), Howard Marsh, is now open for business and just in time for birding week, which runs from May 4-13. The park, located at 611 S. Howard Road in Curtice, OH, features some 6 miles of hiking trails – a quarter mile of which is of boardwalk construction over newly restored wetlands – as well as about 7 miles of kayaking canals for those so inclined. Two special docks with roller launch pads are available for launching kayaking paddlers and their equipment. See the Metroparks website for more details.
