## Best Shot Target Area for July

For the July Best Shot target area we will head southwest, down old State Route 24 (new SR 295) to Providence Metropark, which is just across the Maumee River from Grand Rapids, OH. This park is widely known for its iconic, water-powered grain/saw mill and re-habed canal boat trail. There is also access to


Providence Dam, which juts out across the Maumee River from the park and connects to Mary Jane Thurston Park on the other bank. Considering that Providence is somewhat of a smaller park, we'll throw in Bend View Metropark along with it, since we had no entries from that park when it was offered as an alternative back in February, when our main focus was on Farnsworth MP. Bend View is farther down river, about halfway between Grand Rapids and Waterville, OH.
