7 Ways to Immediately Improve Your Photography (Part 7)

Learn about weather

Weather defines and shapes the out-of-doors in so many ways that it's easy to imagine how much it can influence a natural landscape photograph. It's not uncommon for outdoor photographers to find themselves in a weather or lighting situations where they are caught off guard and somewhat unprepared. That's why when nature photographers know how weather works they are more likely to harness those conditions and use it to their creative advantage. To harness weather to the best of your ability, you need to know about weather conditions and what types of photos would be good for each. For example, dreary, foggy weather in the winter would probably be great for black and white photography. Clearing storms during a lower-angled sun can provide a great opportunity to capture a rainbow in your landscapes. Clouds can also act as a great natural light diffuser in conditions that otherwise would be too harsh or contrasty in direct sunlight. Not only will your knowledge of weather yield more professional photographs, but you'll gain a better appreciation for the varying climates of the places you visit. There's certainly a lot to be mindful of when you're constructing a photograph in the field. However, if you commit to learning and knowing weather, your photography can improve markedly.
