Evergreen Lake Area Trail Closings

In a continuing effort to clear old-growth pine tree stands in the Oak Openings Preserve region, the Metroparks resumed the harvesting of these transplanted giants this past winter and that will continue into the foreseeable future. The current area of focus is the Evergreen Lake area and it's important to note that trails and various sections of the conifer forest will be closed during this period so work can continue without risk to visitor's safety.
