Metroparks Notes and Alerts During COVID-19 Operations

 All 17 Metroparks are currently open for their normal operating hours (7a.m. to dark). Restrooms are open for emergency use. Playgrounds remain closed.

- Please give other park visitors 6-10 feet of social distancing, consider wearing a mask and stay home if you're sick.
- Campgrounds are open effective May 21st. The kayak concession at Farnsworth Metropark is open when river conditions allow. The kayak share at Middlegrounds Metropark is also open.
- Parking may be limited and some areas may be closed to alleviate crowding. This is especially true at Wildwood Metropark, so prepare accordingly.
- While in the park walk, run and bike in single file on the trails to give others room and give warning when passing.
- All indoor facilities are closed. No reservations are currently being accepted.
- All programs are canceled until further notice and all special events are canceled through the summer.
- The Elmer Drive entrance to Toledo Botanical Garden is open, but the Bancroft entrance is closed.
- Park Rangers, as law enforcement officers, have authority to enforce Social Distancing and other rules mandated by Ohio Health Dept. orders. Maintaining a safe distance from others is vital to the health of the community.

The grand opening of the Cannaley Treehouse Village has been postponed until later this summer and may not be available for actual reservations by the general public until next year's camping season.
