Updated Metropark Notes and Alerts During COVID-19 Operations

• All 17 Metroparks are currently open for their normal operating hours (7a.m. to dark). Restrooms are now open as well as all playgrounds. Water fountains are still shut off so please bring your own water.

- Please give other park visitors 6-10 feet of social distancing, consider wearing a mask and stay home if you're sick.
- Campgrounds and cabins are now open. The kayak concession at Farnsworth Metropark is open when river conditions allow. The kayak share at Middlegrounds Metropark is also open.
- Parking may be limited and some areas may be closed to alleviate crowding. This is especially true at Wildwood Metropark, so prepare accordingly.
- While in any park walk, run and bike in single file on the trails to give others room and give warning when passing.
- Reservations for rental facilities are now being accepted with limits on group and total occupancy sizes.
- All programs are canceled until further notice and all special events are canceled through the summer.
- Park Rangers, as law enforcement officers, have authority to enforce social distancing and other rules mandated by Ohio Health Dept. orders. Maintaining a safe distance from others is vital to the health of the community.

NCCT Member Wins First Place in Local Photography Contest

NCCT member Frank Patz has taken 1st place for his photo, "Beauty at Kitty Todd," in the *Native Plants* category of the Oak Openings Photo Contest, which ended just a few weeks ago. This turned out to be a photo that Frank had taken of a Yellow Fringed Orchid (Platanthera ciliaris) at our summer outing at Kitty Todd Preserve in July of 2018. Look for his name in the June edition of the Oak Openings e-newsletter published by the Green Ribbon Initiative. Kudos to Frank for representing our club in good standing as we continue to struggle through this COVID-19 pandemic. It just goes to show that archived material can have great value just as well as new work. It never hurts to drag something out of storage and give it renewed exposure, either in a contest, exhibition, or on our website. Good work should not remain sequestered away forever.

Sawyer Quarry Update

NCCT members Lee and Marge Meserve recently visited Sawyer Quarry in Wood County, the venue of our spring outing in 2019, and wanted to pass along their observations about the current conditions found at that site. Lee says:

"The 'rustic' trail that circumnavigates the quarry is now open to the public. One caveat: it IS rustic with gullies, roots, and rocks, so should be entered a bit cautiously. With the heavy rain last year, standing water was at an all time depth, attracting several species of dragonfly. There's only a small amount (of dragonflies) this year, but it's still worth a visit. The building at the entrance is being renovated into an interpretive center that should open toward the end of summer."

This type of info can often be good material for the newsletter and all members are encouraged to send in their reviews of their visits to various parks and nature areas, both near and far, that they find interesting– both for the good *and* bad aspects of their adventures.
